Message From The Director

While the shelter-in-place order will have our Head Start and Senior Centers closed through May 30th, the Human Services team continues to provide services and critically needed basic supplies to our clients and constituents. Seniors, families with young children and homeless neighbors are receiving prepared meals, grocery bags, educational supplies, diapers, masks and hand sanitizer. Outreach teams are in the community carrying critical public health messaging about safety and resources. We are serving over 15, 000 meals per week and expanding. Client services for preschoolers to vulnerable seniors continue with bi-weekly phone check ins. Non-profit grants continue to flow to ensure our community partners can do their critical work during this time of deep need. We are also focusing on recovery and how we will safely re-open our programs and augment the mental health, financial, and support services our community will need to thrive. We are here for you,

Supporting Our Seniors

Downtown Oakland and North Oakland Senior Centers in coordination with Spectrum Community Services are providing drive-by prepared meals for Seniors, soon to include groceries from Mandela Market Place. The East Oakland Senior Center and Alameda County Food Bank continue to provide weekly brown bags up to 500 bags every Wednesday morning.

Meals-on-Wheels has expanded home delivery for our most vulnerable seniors, including MSSP and Senior Center participants and funded with a grant from Oakland's COVID Relief Fund. Providing Resources for Unsheltered Residents

Our work for the homeless community is focused on health and hygiene, safe distancing in existing programs, and expanding shelter and isolation opportunities. In partnership with World Central Kitchen, 5,300 meals each week are delivered to encampments, shelters, and housing facilities with vulnerable residents. On May 6, the City opened a 67-trailer, double-occupancy and respite program for homeless Oakland residents who are most at-risk. Next month, HSD will launch a family shelter in Emeryville to serve 20-25 families.

The City is also partnering with Alameda County on supporting the launch of a variety of hotels to serve our homeless neighbors to provide appropriate treatment and isolation for the most vulnerable.

Support Our Community By Getting Involved

Starting in June, the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) will provide free meals to all youth up to 18 years of age and all adults with disabilities enrolled in a school program. The program will deliver meals to City recreation centers, libraries and community sites throughout the summer. If interested, please call 510-615-5786.

Distributing Food & Diapers To Head Start Families

- 750 Families served, that includes extending distribution to our Delegate and Partner agencies.
- 450 Families receive diapers and educational materials in conjunction with food boxes.
- Staff are reaching out to families regularly to check-in, provide support, and connect families to other community resources.
