## 1. COVID-19 Vaccine Update

## A. Help us fight COVID-19 by getting vaccinated & tested!

Vaccination continues to protect against severe COVID-19 illness, but with the COVID-19 Delta variant now infecting a small percentage of vaccinated people as well as many unvaccinated people, Alameda County has issued a new health order requiring masks indoors in public places.



California has now changed its mask requirements to match CDC guidance. Bay

Area Counties <u>require everyone</u>, <u>including fully vaccinated people</u>, <u>to wear a mask in indoor public settings</u> to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Vaccines remain the most powerful tool in the fight against COVID-19, including the Delta variant. They are safe, effective, and FREE for everyone 12 and older.
