November 3, 2020



A ballot that is mailed on or before Election Day must be received in ROV no later than **17** days after Election Day.

Sanitation Supplies

Disinfectant, Hand Sanitizer, Paper Towels for regular cleaning and disinfecting



Personal Protective Equipment

Face masks, gloves, and face shields



Social Distancing

Implement 6ft rule using signs. Increased amount of space needed.

Election Workers can make up to \$475

Priority is given to those who are available to serve all 4 days at the AVLs




Accessible Voting Touchscreens




