Applicants will need to bring the following to their appointment:

- Original (or certified) copies of birth or naturalization certificate; or previously issued passport
- Completed DS-11 forms
- Passport photos
- Photocopies of valid government-issued identification; physical identification must also be present
- US Department of State Passport Fee (Passport Book \$110 for applicants ages 16 and over, \$80 for children ages 15 and younger; Passport Card \$30 for applicants ages 16 and over, \$15 for children ages 15 and younger. Include an additional \$60 for expedited service), payable by check or money order\*
- City of Oakland acceptance fee (\$35), payable by cash, check or money order\*

New ITD Service Portal - On Monday, August 27th, the Information Technology Department (ITD) launched the ITD Service Portal which resides on our newly acquired Service now Customer Management Platform. City staff can now open Help Desk tickets via this Portal using the "GET HELP" icon. Additionally, the ITD Service Portal includes a "MY STUFF" feature which allows employees to track the history of their tickets. ITD has also included a "KNOWLEDGE" section consisting of IT articles and news beneficial to City staff.

Since last month's launch, approximately 100 Help Desk incidents have been opened via the Portal. We have received very positive feedback on how easy the Portal is to use. If you have not done so already, we encourage you to explore this functionality.

To access the ITD Service Portal, launch Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge (do not use Internet Explorer). Click the following link, <a href="http://ITDServicePortal/">http://ITDServicePortal/</a> and enter your windows login credentials.

In the "Pick an account" window, select your @oaklandnet.com email address if it appears and enter the corresponding password. If your @oaklandnet.com email address does not appear, click "Use another account", enter the @oaklandnet.com email address and the corresponding password.

Youth-to-Youth Mini Grants Celebration - On September 14, there was a celebration of Youth-to-Youth-Mini-Grants at Impact Hub in Oakland. In October 2016, the City of Oakland Human Services Department (HSD) launched Oakland Resiliency in Communities after Stress and Trauma (ReCAST), a project focused on resiliency, healing and equity for communities that have been impacted by high levels of violence, trauma and civil unrest. Oakland ReCAST builds on several HSD programs to increase the use of trauma-informed practices in the systems designed to help these communities. In April 2017, Oakland ReCAST, in partnership with the Oakland Youth Advisory Commission (OYAC) kicked off the first, pilot cycle of the #OYACgivesback Youth-to-Youth Mini-Grant program with a focus on strengthening community and law enforcement relations in partnership with the Oakland Police Department.

City Releases First Cultural Plan in 30 Years – On Monday, September 17, the City of Oakland released a new Cultural Plan, its first in thirty years. Titled "Belonging in Oakland: A Cultural Development Plan," the document provides a roadmap to support and lift up the role of culture in building a just and equitable city – so that every Oaklander in every neighborhood has access to cultural amenities. The Plan was adopted by the City Council after a robust community engagement process. The final Plan is now available on the City's website at

www.oaklandca.gov/resources/cultural-plan. The tagline for the Plan "Equity is the Driving Force, Culture is the Frame, and Belonging is the Goal" indicates how the plan was developed and suggests the foundation needed to strengthen Oakland's cultural ecosystem and the city. The Plan offers up a new lens for supporting culture in Oakland, recognizing that an alignment of culture and equity is required for Oaklanders to realize their potential – and offers specific strategies for getting

there. Building on the Plan and its vision, the City's Cultural Affairs unit will launch two new initiatives in 2019:

- 1. The "Neighborhood Voice: Belonging in Oakland" grant program will support art-based civic engagement projects throughout the city that will enliven a healthy, just and vibrant civil society.
- 2. An Artist-In-Residence (AIR) program in City government designed to bring new approaches to civic challenges and service delivery by engaging Oaklanders in unique ways, advancing the missions of various City departments and benefitting neighborhoods.
