Dear Neighbor,

With our Oakland students back in school, I would like to express my deepest gratitude for the organizations that have and continue to provide our children with tools they need for academic success. My office had the pleasure of attending the Oakland Police Department and the <u>Lend A Hand Foundation</u>'s annual backpack giveaways earlier this month, where students not only received school supplies but were able to connect with their peers and relish in some final summer fun. My office also celebrated the first day of the school year with <u>Youth Uprising</u>, who hosted their welcome back event giving away school supplies, while enjoying live entertainment, arts and craft, and more! Lastly, we ended the first week at <u>Reach Academy</u>, who through the assistance of community partners provided school supplies to all of their students.



Serving as the Education Partnership Chair for the City of Oakland, I will continue to share out resources for students and parents to transition back to school safely. I also look forward to discussing and executing strategies, in partnership with Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) leaders, that will optimize this academic year for our students. In the interim, I encourage residents to review OUSD's safety guidelines for the school year:

- Masks will continue to be required for all students and staff on campus while they are indoors.
- Students and staff should stay home if they are experiencing COVID-like symptoms, even if they are vaccinated.
- Testing is available at <u>10 OUSD locations</u> with additional communitybased locations throughout the city. At-home testing kits will also be available at each school site. Please consider getting tested if you are feeling symptoms or have been exposed to a COVID-positive individual.
- Vaccines are highly recommended for all community members, ages 12 and up. We are partnering with Alameda County to reach out to all students, staff, and families to support them with accessing the vaccine.
- Ventilation has been upgraded in all of OUSD's filter-based HVAC systems, and additional air purifiers have been installed in all classrooms and shared spaces.

Keep Oakland Safe & Protected

We must continue to progress our goals to reimagine and transform our public safety system. As we face growing challenges through the pandemic, it is critical that proven strategies and approaches are resourced and implemented.

East Oakland Budget Amendments Unanimously Passed: East Oakland, we did it! Through your continuous advocacy and partnership, on July 26, the Council reopened the budget to adopt some of the public safety, traffic calming, workforce development and beautification investments our community requested earlier this year. While we must go further to secure an equitable amount of resources for our community, because of your engagement, we took a great step forward. New Masking Requirement: Vaccination continues to protect against severe COVID-19 illness, but with the COVID-19 Delta variant now infecting a small percentage of vaccinated people as well as many unvaccinated people, Alameda County has issued a new health order requiring masks indoors in public places.

<u>California has now changed its mask requirements</u> to match CDC guidance.

Bay Area Counties <u>require everyone, including fully vaccinated people, to</u> <u>wear a mask in indoor public settings</u> to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Vaccines remain the most powerful tool in the fight against COVID-19, including the Delta variant. They are safe, effective, and FREE for everyone 12 and older. Oakland's Residential Eviction Moratorium Not Affected by State or Federal Moratoriums. With renewed conversation around the residential eviction moratorium, Oakland wants to remind tenants and property owners that the end of a State or federal moratorium *would not* affect Oakland's residential eviction moratorium currently in place. Oakland's moratorium on evictions and rent increases will last until the Local Emergency is terminated by Oakland City Council.
