CITY OF OAKLAND'S 2015-2017 BUDGET PROCESS UNDERWAY!

The process for developing the City of Oakland's next two-year budget (2015-2017) is underway and will continue to be a major focus for me and all of City Hall through the end of June. As provided by the new "Budget Process, Fiscal Planning, Transparency, and Public Participation" policy that was developed in 2013-2014, three of the budget process deadlines include:


- March 15 – Submission of Councilmember Priorities
- April 15 – City Administrator's Budget Outlook Message & Calendar Report
- May 1 – Release of Mayor & City Administrator's Proposed Budget.

We will have difficult choices facing us for our upcoming budget. Legislative Update: Bullhook Ban

You may remember that Councilmember Gallo and I jointly sponsored legislation last year to ban the use of torturous instruments, such as the infamous bullhook, for use in Oakland to control or train elephants. Since the Oakland Zoo had already banned the use of bullhooks some two decades ago, the practical objective of this legislation was to prevent circus elephants from being tortured. Oakland was the second city in the country to pass this legislation, after Los Angeles. In order to gain support among a majority of Councilmembers and some stakeholders, the ban was written to go into effect in September of 2017. Special thanks to the Teamsters for helping to broker a workable compromise.



We thought that once several other jurisdictions followed our lead, the major circuses in the United States would eventually end their practice of using elephants—a practice that is only possible if the elephants go through tremendous torture as part of their training process. Lo and behold, sooner than we had thought, [Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus announced](#) that by 2018, they will no longer use elephants in their circus.


It's good to be reminded that every so often, taking action at the local level can have positive national implications. Oakland once again can take credit as a national leader. My thanks go to Oakland Zoo officials, the Humane Society and many local animal welfare activists for their research and advocacy. And thanks to Mayor Libby Schaaf, who, as a councilmember, first put this issue on the agenda.

Legislative Update: Seismic Safety

I've been working with city staff for the past several months crafting an ordinance to ensure that when the next major earthquake hits the East Bay, people who live in any of the nearly 1,500 soft-story apartment buildings in our city will be safe. The city held a series of public workshops, and we are continuing to meet with stakeholders before finalizing the ordinance. We plan to bring the ordinance to the City Council for consideration later this spring.

3. **Santa Fe Elementary School** to Re-open

Thanks in large part to the work of the Santa Fe Community And Neighbors (Santa Fe CAN), the Oakland Unified School District has decided to allow the children of families

who live near the Santa Fe Elementary School to attend their neighborhood school during the two-year period (starting in the fall of 2016) in which it will be re-opened to accommodate a school cross town that will be undergoing extensive seismic safety repairs. While this is only an interim victory for families in the Santa Fe, Golden Gate and Longfellow neighborhoods who want the neighborhood school to be reopened long term, it opens the door for consideration of a more permanent solution down the road. Congrats to all who worked to make this happen.
