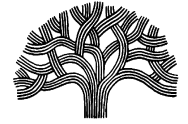

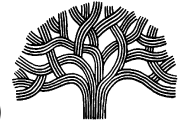

A. Call to Order/Approval of Agenda

G. Green called the meeting to order at 5:42 p.m.

Action: Item D to be heard first, as quorum not yet established.

B. Roll Call/Determination of Quorum/Recite AC-OCAP Promise

Roll was called by Staff M. Francisco. A quorum was established at 5:50 p.m., after Item D commenced. The AC-OCAP Promise was recited.

D. Presentation – Casey Farmer: Census 2020

The Board welcomed back Casey Farmer, Executive Director of the Complete Count Committee (CCC), for an update on Census outreach efforts. The CCC was allocated \$1.5 million by Alameda County to achieve a complete and accurate count. The CCC is investing in “trusted messengers” of hard to-count communities to communicate the significance of completing the Census with grants to several agencies. These agencies include educational institutions, houses of worship and other community-based organizations.

Further outreach efforts include a Census Ambassador Program that is accepting applications for general volunteers through February 7, 2020, Questionnaire Assistance Centers at public libraries, K-12 activities, ESL curriculums, Workshops, and a “Know Your Rights” curriculum is currently in the works. Census 2020 temporary employment positions are still available, and Farmer encourages job seekers to apply as soon as possible. Fliers, magnets and postcards were provided to the Board and Staff for distribution. Farmer concluded her update with a question and answer session.

Recruitment continues for Oakland District 1, Oakland District 2, Oakland District 4 and Alameda County-Community. A total of three hundred recruitment packets were mailed to “Current Residents” in CSBG Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4, to libraries and recreation centers. S. Ting detailed efforts to recruit for Alameda County-Community; including reposting Board Recruitment Announcements.

E. Clemons requested sustained efforts by Board Members to fill vacancies. E. Clemons encouraged Board Members to take a leadership role by acquiring a slot on an agenda of a Neighborhood Council (NCPC) to inform and recruit for membership.

2. 2020 Programming (E. Clemons) –

AC-OCAP Update

The 2019 closeout for request for funds continues as well as processing progress reports, to meet the compulsory State reporting deadline of February 14, 2020. E. Clemons discussed the four state contracts that are open, and the various tasks associated with report writing and going before council for approval. The completion of scope-of-works for new grantees is also underway.

With the termination of two grantee contracts, there is a \$47,000 surplus of funds. These funds were reallocated for 2020 Census outreach efforts and food distribution. To deliver the 2020 Census message, Tote Bags designed with #OaklandCounts, the Oakland Tree surrounded by neighborhoods and the 2-1-1 logo are to be procured. The Tote Bags will be used for the March food distribution.

California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC) Update

Don Raulston, AC-OCAP's EITC Coordinator, has seven City Staff employees nearing completion of IRS-certification as we close-in on the opening of the VITA Site at the Business Assistance Center.

With First 5, AC-OCAP has developed a postcard to publicize The Young Child Tax Credit. When completed, the postcard will be sent out to the Network.

Strategic Planning/Consultation – Information was forwarded to the Executive Committee via email and provided as a handout. Tracy Jensen, Sr. Services Administrator in Human Services Department was hired to push the Strategic Planning/Consultation process forward. Interview date and time to be announced.

THE END CHILD POVERTY PLAN

CALIFORNIA CAN BECOME A MODEL FOR THE NATION BY ENDING DEEP CHILD POVERTY AND CUTTING OVERALL CHILD POVERTY IN HALF



CALIFORNIA HAS THE FIFTH-LARGEST GLOBAL ECONOMY, AND THE HIGHEST U.S. CHILD POVERTY RATE

- 1 in 5 California children live in poverty, impacting almost 2 million children
- 450,000 children live in deep poverty (their families earn less than \$13,400 per year)
- California's high cost of living makes the child poverty problem worse

California's Lifting Children and Families Out of Poverty Task Force (created by Assembly Bill 1520 [2017, Burke]) issued its comprehensive recommendations—the **End Child Poverty Plan**—at the end of 2018.

THE END CHILD POVERTY PLAN INCLUDES:

1. A Targeted Child Tax Credit that will put more cash back into families' pockets to support the basic necessities of daily living.
2. CalWORKS safety net grant increases that will bring families receiving CalWORKS to 50% of the federal poverty line (deep poverty), as promised in 2018's CA budget.
3. Expansion of the California Earned Income Tax Credit to build on the success of the current program as a critical anti-poverty tool for working families.
4. Guaranteed access to early care and education for children 0–8 living in poverty.
5. Expanded, voluntary home visiting programs to support families with young children.
6. 20 additional Promise Neighborhoods offering coordinated, community-driven support services.
7. Strengthened, connected, and coordinated workforce training programs for up-skilled jobs that can fundamentally support sustainable upward mobility.
8. Expanded access to Medi-Cal health care for all families at risk of poverty, and increased access to community clinics.
9. Expansion of emergency child care for foster care families, and access to housing for youth aging out of foster care.
10. Rental subsidies for homeless families and families living in poverty.
