You will then be unmuted, during your turn, and allowed to participate in public comment. After the allotted time, you will then be re-muted. - **By Phone.** To comment by phone, please call on one of the above listed phone numbers. You will be prompted to "Raise Your Hand" by pressing STAR-NINE ("*9") to request to speak when Public Comment is being taken on a eligible agenda item at the beginning of the meeting.

Persons may speak on any item appearing on the agenda; however, a Speaker Card must be filled out and given to a representative of the Cannabis Regulatory Commission. Multiple agenda items cannot be listed on one speaker card. If a speaker signs up to speak on multiple items listed on the agenda, the Chairperson may rule that the speaker be given an appropriate allocation of time to address all issues at one time (cumulative) before the items are called. All speakers will be allotted 3 minutes or less – unless the Chairperson allots additional time.

At the June 4, 2020 Cannabis Regulatory Commission Meeting Member Goldsberry moved for this item to be heard at a Special Meeting the following Thursday. Member Tucker seconded the motion and it passed by consensus.

Since June 4th the Special Activity Permits Division and the Department of Economic and Workforce Development (EWD) have distributed a survey to Oakland businesses regarding recent burglaries and looting and created a website with information and resources available for impacted businesses:
