

MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: HISTORY

MLK Jr. Way once represented the dividing line between neighborhoods where Black and Brown Oaklanders could and could not live or buy property.







MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: EXISTING CONDITIONS

MLK Jr. Way is a **truck** route, **bike** route, and **bus** route.












MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: EXISTING CONDITIONS

MLK Jr. Way is also a wide, 4-lane street, with no bike lanes.






MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: PREVIOUS ENGAGEMENT

- Draft Howard Terminal Transportation

- Capital Improvement Program



MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: PREVIOUS ENGAGEMENT


Through years of engagement, key themes have emerged





Pedestrian countdowns are needed at traffic signals






Crosswalk striping is needed where it doesn't exist today

MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: PROJECT LOCATION

The proposed project is located on Martin Luther King, Jr. Way from 2nd Street to 14th Street, connecting to other existing and planned transportation projects, which will create a more complete network.






MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: PROJECT SCOPE

Project Scope:

- Pedestrian access and safety improvements, including:
 - ADA curb ramps
 - High visibility crosswalks
 - Bulb outs
 - New lighting
 - Traffic signal upgrades
 - Pedestrian countdown heads
- New street trees






MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: PROJECT SCOPE

Project Scope (continued):


- Buffered bike lanes from 14th Street to San Pablo.
- Buffered **or** protected bike lanes from 14th Street to 2nd Street.





MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: ADDRESSING INEQUITIES

The project improves accessibility, safety, and climate resiliency in **high and highest Priority Equity** census tracts.





MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: ADDRESSING INEQUITIES

Existing Disparity

Project is in a community most impacted by air pollution.



How Project Addresses Disparity

Project aims to improve air quality by:

- Promoting transportation options to reduce emissions
- Tree planting





MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: ADDRESSING INEQUITIES

Existing Disparity

43% of crash victims on MLK Jr. Way were Black, yet only 22% of Oakland's population is Black.



How Project Addresses Disparity

Project aims to improve safety through:

- Shorter crossings and pedestrian visibility
- Buffered/protected bike lanes
- Protected left turns

MLK JR. WAY STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: TIMELINE AND NEXT STEPS

Prior planning and engagement

Engagement and work begins to draft city and neighborhood plans. MLK Jr. Way is later identified as a priority.



Design and engagement

Engagement begins and informs design work.

2023

Funding secured

\$14.5 million awarded from federal Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant

Construction

2026

Construction likely to begin. Impacted residents and businesses continue to be informed.
