The City of Oakland's Annual Holiday Food Drive Kicks-off – This week the City of Oakland's Annual Holiday Food Drive will kick-off. The Alameda County-Oakland Community Action Partnership (AC-OCAP), in partnership with Alameda County Community Food Bank is coordinating the food drive. The Alameda County Community Food Bank serves 1 in 5 residents of Alameda County. The cost of living in the Bay Area has made it nearly impossible for many households to make ends meet. Children and seniors remain the most vulnerable to hunger in our community. Thanks to City employees, last year in 2016, a total of 620 lbs. of non-perishable food was collected. Food collection barrels will be delivered the week of November 6th to the lobbies at the following locations:

Dashka Slater Discusses True Account, 57 Bus, at Main Library – On Wednesday, November 15, starting at 12:15 pm, in an author talk at the Main Library (125 14th Street), Dashka Slater will discuss her new book, The 57 Bus: A True Story of Two Teenagers and the Crime That Changed Their Lives, and the events involving two Oakland teens that made international news. In the 2013 incident, two high school students from Oakland made international news while riding an AC Transit bus. A white, non-gender-conforming teen from the hills was heading to a small private school; a black teen from a crime-plagued neighborhood in the flats was on his way to a large public school. Their paths overlapped in a single reckless act that left one severely burned and the other charged with hate crimes and facing life imprisonment. The 57 Bus, an electrifying YA book of immediate local interest, examines the incident from all sides. OakDOT 'Paint the Town!' Deadline November 30 -- On September 19, the Oakland Department of Transportation (OakDOT) released the application for Paint the Town!, a pilot program allowing Oaklanders to paint temporary murals on Oakland roads. The application will be open until November 30. The application is free - no fee to apply. OakDOT will approve up to 30 applications. If chosen, applicants will be responsible for paint, supplies, and street closure permits. All applications who apply for Paint the Town! will automatically be reviewed by The Oakland Fund, a local nonprofit organization, which will select projects to provide in-kind support, including a designer, paint and supplies, and the costs of the special event permit for installation (artists' fees are not eligible). OakDOT will review proposed project locations to see if other street improvements—such as curb ramp upgrades—can be made by the City. OakDOT will prioritize historically disadvantaged communities. For every application received in a low-disadvantaged community, OakDOT will select two applications in a disadvantaged community as determined by MTC data. OakDOT will not maintain any street murals, and a mural may be removed by the City at any time.

\$3 Million Grant To Help Create Permanently Affordable Space For Arts, Cultural Organizations - On Tuesday, November 7, the Kenneth Rainin Foundation announced \$3 million in additional funding for the Community Arts Stabilization Trust (CAST), a game-changing organization that protects San Francisco Bay Area arts and cultural organizations from displacement. This three-year grant will help CAST realize an ambitious goal to acquire 100,000 square feet of space for arts groups by the end of 2018. With this funding, CAST will expand and prioritize its work in Oakland to create permanently affordable spaces for arts organizations. The funding will also help CAST continue its work in San Francisco. CAST is a first of its kind real estate holding company that serves the cultural sector. Launched in 2013 with a \$5 million seed grant from the Rainin Foundation, CAST took immediate and bold steps to provide real estate security for vital community arts organizations at risk. CAST's collaborative approach has been essential to their continued growth and success. By working closely with real estate developers, city government, local arts commissions and other stakeholders, CAST helps arts nonprofits survive in a challenging real estate marketplace. Solutions include acquiring properties for lease/buy back by arts organizations, master leasing to sustain affordable rents and building the capacity of nonprofits to help them gain a permanent asset without jeopardizing their core operations. In 2016, the Rainin Foundation and William and Flora Hewlett Foundation awarded CAST an additional \$1.3 million. CAST used this funding to start a capital fund to initiate an arts real estate acquisition program in Oakland and launch Keeping Space—Oakland, a pilot program that provides technical and financial assistance to arts groups. The program aims to be the most equitable bike share system in the world, with \$5/year introductory memberships to residents enrolled in CalFresh, Muni Lifeline Passes, or the PG&E CARE utility discount. The system is also integrated with the Clipper Card program, creating a seamless transportation system throughout the Bay Area. SunShares pools the buying power of individual participants to get more competitive pricing from solar companies and vehicle manufacturers. The City of Oakland is participating in the program to help support our clean energy and climate goals, reduce pollution, and make it easier for all members of our community to save energy and money. Bay Area Sunshares is a limited-time community opportunity. Pre-vetted solar installers have been selected and will be available starting August 7 to schedule home solar evaluations. The officers took the suspect into custody. On Sunday, November 5, at 12:20 am, Oakland Police officers responded to the 1400 block of High Street where a strong arm robbery had taken place. The suspect fled in a vehicle, but OPD officers later located him in the 5800 block of Foothill Boulevard. The suspect was detained and arrested. On Tuesday, November 7 at approximately 4:24 pm, Oakland Police officers attempted to stop a vehicle in connection with firearms in the area of 98th Avenue and Edes Avenue. The vehicle failed to stop and a pursuit ensued. The pursuit ended when the suspect vehicle crashed near the intersection of Lakeshore Avenue and Lake Park Avenue. Three suspects were taken into custody. A fourth suspect fled, but was struck by a car that had the right-of-way. This suspect was transported to a local hospital where he was listed in critical condition. During the investigation, firearms were recovered. Investigators believe the suspects and or suspect vehicle may be connected to shootings in Oakland and other jurisdictions.
