January 31 Deadline for Youth-to-Youth Mini-Grants -- On Wednesday, December 13, the City of Oakland Human Services Department's (HSD) Youth Advisory Commission (OYAC) announced the release of the second #OYACgivesback Youth-to-Youth mini-grant application: Supporting Community Resiliency and Healing for Oakland. #OYACgivesback is a project of Oakland Resiliency in Communities After Stress and Trauma (ReCAST), an HSD initiative funded by the Substance Abuse Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA), which focuses on resiliency and equity for communities that have been impacted by high levels of violence, trauma and civil unrest. #OYACgivesback is one component of Oakland ReCAST that supports community work to increase community resiliency and healing. The Oakland Youth Commission will help select and award creative and dynamic projects of up to \$5,000, developed by youth between the ages of 13 and 21. Oakland Police officers responded and located Francisca Martinez-Ramirez, 38, of Oakland, suffering from fatal gunshot wounds. During the investigation on scene, officers located and arrested Anastacio Enrique Sandoval, 44, of Oakland. On January 3, 2018, the Alameda County District Attorney's office charged Sandoval for the murder of Martinez-Ramirez. On January 1, 2018, at 5:22 pm, the Oakland Police officers responded to a shooting in the 3400 block of Adeline Street. Responding officers located Tearence Garnett, 36, of Oakland, suffering from a gunshot wound. Garnett was transported to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries. During the investigation on scene, officers located and arrested Edward Barlow, 53, of Oakland.
