Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Ace Kids Golf (AKG) program escorted 29 Oakland youth to the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. Participants were exposed to an educational experience of professional golf which included: the practice of courtesy and respect while interacting with other attendees, associating with VIP's on the 18th Hole, and receiving golf tips from pro-golfers at the celebrity golf challenge such as Bill Murray, Clint Eastwood, Alfonso Ribeiro, Kelly Rohrbach, and Larry Fitzgerald.
